# Council Action Summary August 2001

## August 13, 2001

Proclaimed the week of August 19 - 25, 2001 as Community Health Center Week in Beaufort County. Ms. Earthile Gray, Chairman of the Beaufort-Jasper-Hampton Comprehensive Health Board, accepted the proclamation.

Returned to the Seabrook Community Center for operation the Seabrook Community Center Organization once it achieves a nonprofit 501(c)(3) status.

Accepted a Department of Justice FY 2001 Local Law Enforcement Grant. The award is in the amount of \$151,497 with a mandatory County match of \$16,833 from the Sheriff's Department budget.

Accepted the \$1.6 million highway improvement plan (the area from the Broad River Bridge to SC Highway 280), expended up to \$1 million of the excess revenue collected from the one-cent sales tax for the SC Highway 170 project, and deleted the landscaping value of \$462,527 with the expenditure for the landscaping to be determined at a future date.

Expended \$1.2 million on the redesign of the ramp and the configuration of the approach to the parking area at the northern terminus at the Broad River Bridge.

Accepted the proposal of Sharma Management in response to RFP 4971/010660 to construct and use a Leasehold Improvement (and Aircraft Storage Hangar) at the Hilton Head Airport subject to the negotiations and approval of a satisfactory ground rental lease.

Awarded a contract to Advanced Video, Columbia, SC in the amount of \$127,071 for a Traffic Management Program for SC Highway 170.

Awarded a contract to Peach State Ambulance of Tyrone, Georgia in the amount of \$546,526 for six, Type I ambulances with 2002 Ford F450 chassis.

Approved the purchase of a Remotec manufactured Model F6A Andros robot to be used to support public safety and first responders throughout the Beaufort County area.
