April 8, 2002

Announced that County employees received the United Way 2001 Achievement Award for outstanding support of the community. County employee contributions totaled \$40,039.

Recognized the Class of 1952 of Penn Normal, Industrial and Agricultural School upon the occasion of the celebration of their 50th graduation anniversary. Mrs. Gardenia Simmons-White accepted the proclamation.

Proclaimed April 2002 as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Ms. Judy Sherman, Special Projects Coordinator, Department of Social Services, accepted the proclamation.

Adopted a resolution requesting the assistance of Senator Strom Thurmond, Senator Ernest Hollings, Congressman Joe Wilson and Congressman James Clyburn in the form of Federal Highway Administration funding in the amount of \$18 million to be used for the widening of six lanes of US Highway 278 from the bridges of Hilton Head Island west to Simmonsville Road in Bluffton.

Entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Town of Hilton Head Island regarding the construction, use, and maintenance of a public boat ramp on Town property and wetlands mitigation on the Mathews Drive parcel.

Accepted an FAA grant in the amount of \$124,689 for reimbursement of additional security costs at the Hilton Head Island Airport as a result of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack.

Asked Wilbur Smith Associates to prepare an alternative \$6,000,000 intersection improvements at the Gardens Corner intersection at US Highway 21 and US Highway 17.

Filed a Notice of Appeal pursuant to the statute which requires an appeal to County Council and to file a separate Notice of Appeal to the Circuit Court as it relates to the findings of Hearing Officer Earnest A. Finney, Jr. in the case of *Beaufort County vs. Wilbert Roller*, *Parcel 600-31B-8 and 9*, 1.167 acres.

Participated along with The Nature Conservancy and state/federal organizations and purchase two undeveloped parcels of land: (i) North Williman Island, approximately 8,463 acres, total purchase price \$4,000,035, County's contribution \$1,000,000 and (ii) Buzzard Island, approximately 120 acres, total purchase price \$600,000, County's contribution \$150,000. The funding source is the \$40 million bond referendum passed in 2000.
