BEAUFORT COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING ON November 15, 2017

The regular meeting of the Beaufort County Transportation Committee (BCTC) was held on November 15, 2017 in the Executive Conference Room of the Beaufort County Administrative Complex located at 100 Ribaut Road, Beaufort, South Carolina.

- 1. <u>Call to Order & Members Roll Call</u>. Meeting was called to order at approximately 4:00 p.m. by Chairman Gordon and an attendance roll call was taken. A quorum was not achieved for this meeting.
- 2. Public Comment. There was no public comment given.
- 3. <u>Approval of Minutes</u>. Minutes from the September 20, 2017 meeting could not be approved due to the lack of a quorum. September 20, 2017 meeting minutes will be presented at the January 2018 meeting for approval.

4. Old Business

- A. **Program/Project Updates**. Mr. McFee provided an update on the following projects.
- (1) <u>Dirt Road Paving Contracts 50A and 50WE</u>. Dirt Road Paving Contracts 50A and 50 WE were awarded by County Council on September 27, 2017. Both projects are a design-bid-build instead of the design-build contracts that have been completed previously. County Engineering wanted to complete a design-bid-build in order to compare construction pricing. Contracts 50A and 50WE are the last remaining dirt roads to be paved under the old BCTC dirt road paving program.

Contract 50A was awarded to J. H. Hiers for a total amount of \$2,170,247 and will be funded by TAG funds. Contract 50A includes Butler Farm Road, Johnson Landing Road and Trotters Loop. Total mileage is 2.42 miles. The roads were designed by Andrews Engineering. J. H. Hiers has been issued a notice to proceed. Substantial completion date for Contract 50A is October 28, 2018. Clearing and grubbing has been started on Butler Farm Road.

Contract 50WE was awarded to Preferred Materials, Inc., (PMI) for a total dirt road paving amount of \$2,397,957 and will be funded by C Funds. Contract 50WE included Albertha Fields Circle, Almond Drive, Coker Lane, Devonwood Drive, Mary Smalls Road and Shiney Road. Total mileage is 2.28 miles. The roads were designed by Ward Edwards. Contract 50WE also includes repairs to the Bluffton Parkway Flyover Bridge embankment which is funded by County's Bluffton Parkway Phase 5 Sales Tax project account. The embankment repairs totaled \$100,270. PMI has been issued a notice to proceed. Substantial completion date for Contract 50WE is October 28, 2018. PMI will start on the embankment repairs first and then proceed on to the dirt road reconstruction.

(2) <u>2017 Nonrecurring Funded Projects</u>. The BCTC approved 4 projects at \$1,940,000 for 2017 programming by SCDOT using the 2017 nonrecurring funds totaling \$1,295,000, 25% mandatory allocation and non-programmed C funds.

The 4 projects were the resurfacing of Palmetto Bay Road on Hilton Head Island at \$1.7 million and the bridge approaches at Chowan Creek Bridge & US 21, Broad River Bridge & SC 170, and Cheechessee River Bridge & SC 170 at \$80,000 each for a total of \$240,000. Mr. McFee indicated that these 4 projects have been programmed by SCDOT and should be out for bid after the first of the year.

(3) <u>2017 Municipality/County CTC Funded Projects</u>. At the September 2017 BCTC meeting, the committee approved funding for the following municipality /county requested projects.

Town of Hilton Head – Pope Avenue Resurfacing Improvements	\$850,000
Beaufort County – US 278 Signal Timing Improvements	\$ 89,000
Town of Port Royal/Beaufort County - Paris Avenue/Ribaut Road Intersection Traffic Signal Upgrades	\$ 40,000
City of Beaufort - Resurfacing Improvements Phase 1 only roads located in the City Limits	\$290,000

The County Transportation Department has started ordering hardware and supplies for the Paris Avenue/Ribaut Road intersection traffic signal upgrades. County Engineering Department will notify the municipalities the approved BCTC's funding totals. The minutes from the September 20, 2017 meeting contains the details for each approved municipality and County match funding.

- (4) <u>2018 Resurfacing Program (Years 1 & 2)</u>. The County Engineering Department is working on bid documents for the County road resurfacing projects recommended in the Pavement Condition Survey. The 2018 Resurfacing Program should be advertised for bid during December 2017.
- B. <u>October 2017 LATS Policy Board Meeting</u>. Chairman Gordon reviewed the October 2017 LATS committee meeting with the BCTC. Treasury Secretary Hall spoke to the LATS Committee. It was noted that for the next 10 years there are no widening improvements for I-95. There will be life safety maintenance performed on I-95.
- C. <u>2017 CTC-SCDOT Regional Meeting</u>. SCDOT held a CTC regional meeting on October 25, 2017 in Charleston. Chairman Gordon attended. The CTC members and SCDOT discussed the rebuilding of the state highways and the state secondary road ranking process. The regional meeting should become an annual event.

5. New Business.

- A. <u>February 2018 Workshop</u>. The BCTC's workshop will be held on February 28, 2018 in the training room at BJWSA. County Council's Public Facilities Committee has been invited to attend. Chairman Gordon reviewed the recommended topics for the workshop.
- B. **FY 2018** 1st **Quarter Financial Statement**. Mr. DeVito presented the attached FY 2018 1st Quarter financial statement. The statement is a summation of the revenue and expenditures occurring from July 1st thru September 30th. The 1st quarter statement also shows funding commitments total \$5.0 million.
- C. <u>2018 BCTC Meeting Schedule</u>. The BCTC will hold its regular meetings in 2018 on the following dates: January 17, March 21, May 16, July 18, September 19, and November 14. All the meetings are scheduled to start at 4:00 pm and will be held in the County's Executive Conference Room, Administration Building, County Government Robert Smalls Complex, 100 Ribaut Road, Beaufort, SC.
- D. <u>Off Agenda Item</u> <u>Pavement Management Survey</u>. The committee members discussed the municipalities' participation in the next PM survey and would the BCTC be willing to help fund. Town of Port Royal has completed a PM survey but did not use ADT or PMS in place. Mr. Shoemaker indicated that the Town of Hilton Head did complete a survey and will attempt to locate for BCTC. There were no representatives present from either the Town of Bluffton or City of Beaufort. Mr. DeVito stated that a topic that should be discussed by the BCTC is the CTC's responsibility to all public roadways in both the unincorporated County and the municipalities.

- 6. Public Comment. There was no public comment given.
- 8. <u>Meeting Adjourned</u>. The next regular meeting the BCTC will be January 17, 2018 at 4:00 p.m., in the Executive Conference Room, County Administration Building, Robert Smalls Complex, Beaufort, SC.
