Chairman Gwen Johnson Smith called the August 28, 2014 Lowcountry Council of Governments regular board meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. She then turned the gavel over to incoming Chairman Nat Shaffer. Chairman Shaffer led the Pledge of Allegiance after which Evon Robinson gave the invocation. The Chairman asked everyone to remember Jim Outlaw, whose wife Ann passed away earlier in the week. Introduction of guests and staff followed. New LCOG Board Member (Hardeeville City Council Member) Carolyn Kassel was welcomed. Chairman Shaffer presented the June 26, 2014 Board Meeting Minutes, and without objection, declared the minutes approved. He then presented Gwen Smith with a plaque commemorating her tenure as LCOG Board Chairman and thanked her for her year's service. Proxies noted by the Executive Director included Esther Black to

the Chair, Billy Keyserling to Brian Flewelling, and Jim Outlaw to Pete Hagood. All were general proxies. The meeting proceeded after determining a quorum was present.

Chairman Shaffer continued by recognizing the 2014-2015 Board Officers and At-Large Executive Committee Members: Vice Chairman – Tommy Mann/Colleton County, Secretary – Gerald Dawson/Beaufort County, Treasurer – Henry Etheridge/Jasper County; Executive Committee Members Brian Flewelling/Beaufort County, Gene Whetsell/Colleton County, Pete Hagood/Hampton County, and Gwen Smith/Jasper County.

Chairman Shaffer addressed Old Business and recognized Ginnie Kozak for an update on the US 17 Widening Project in Jasper County. An updated LCOG Transportation Committee Project Summary, prepared by SCDOT staff, was reviewed. The US 17 project was on the Agenda for information only. Ginnie spoke about the project's rising cost, the road's poor condition and safety issues, its statewide and national importance, and the need to secure other funding sources. She said SCDOT Commissioners recommended a joint meeting between the LCOG Board and the LATS Policy Committee. The meeting is scheduled September 17 at 5:30 p.m. in the Sargent Jasper Park meeting room. Discussion followed and centered on the project's importance well beyond the Lowcountry Region. SCDOT staff will attend. Transportation Committee Chairman George Williams urged all LCOG Board Members to be there. Ginnie Kozak briefly reviewed other transportation projects on the list.

With no New Business on the Agenda, Chairman Shaffer called for Reports and recognized Sherry Smith for the June and July Finance Reports. Copies were in meeting packets. Sherry reported June Accounts Receivable at an all-time high. There was considerable improvement in July, but cashflow continues to be challenging. The COG increased invoicing State for Workforce expenses to twice monthly and is considering doing the same for Aging. Chris Bickley noted that slow reimbursement from the State is a statewide issue. Sherry said the COG's auditors will soon begin their annual audit, and the report will be presented at the October meeting.

Michelle Knight was unable to attend, and Chris Bickley submitted the Community & Economic Development Report as written. The department has 53 active projects with another three in the application process.

The Executive Director's Report was submitted by Chris Bickley as written and without additional comment.

Chairman Shaffer called for a motion to enter Executive Session to discuss personnel matters that was made by Brian Flewelling, seconded by Mary Beth Heyward, and unanimously approved. Three items were on the Agenda for Executive Session discussion: New Executive Director Search Committee Status Report, Loaned Employee Program, and Employee Annual Leave Accrual. Afterwards, Chairman Shaffer declared the meeting returned to Open Session. He stated the items discussed were those listed on the Agenda and that only one item required action. Bill McBride made a motion to approve the COG's Loaned Employee Program as described in the statement and recommended by staff during the Executive Session. Mary Beth Heyward seconded the motion. Brief discussion followed during which Chris Bickley confirmed the program will be managed to have fewer than fifty employees at all times. The motion carried by majority with dissenting votes from Bobby Bonds and Tommy Mann.

During Council Time Pete Hagood commented on the recent Nevamar plant closing in Hampton County.

With no additional business to address, and on motion duly made, seconded and approved, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 8:05 p.m. Copies of the agenda were distributed prior to the meeting. A notice of the meeting was posted on the LCOG bulletin board at least twenty-four hours prior to the meeting.

The Beaufort County/Lowcountry Regional HOME Consortium Advisory Committee met on Thursday, September 18, 2014 at 2:00PM at Lowcountry Council of Governments to discuss the following and make recommendations to the Board for approval:

# Review of 2013-2014 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER)

The Program Year 2013-2014 was Beaufort County/Lowcountry Regional HOME Consortium's eighth year of funding through the US Department of Housing and Urban Development Department's HOME Investment Partnerships Program. This Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report highlights progress made in implementing the Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan for Housing. During the eighth program year (July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014) Lowcountry Regional HOME Consortium (LRHC) expended approximately \$772,210 in HOME funds and contributed 25% local match.

Progress includes: completed 69 rehab units, completed 1 new construction unit, and assisted 6 families with tenant based rental assistance.

# Rehab Projects:

BEAUFORT COUNTY: completed 11 rehab units completed 2 rehab units completed 10 rehab units

JASPER COUNTY: completed 5 rehab units and the 41-unit Mercy Circle Complex

Total: 69 rehab units completed

#### New Construction:

LowCountry Habitat for Humanity: 1 unit completed, 1 unit under construction, 2 units to get started

# Tenant Based Rental Assistance

Beaufort Housing Authority – 6 units

All programs are project based and participants usually come from a waiting list. The only program an individual can directly contact LRHC about is the down payment assistance program.



- 1. The S. C. Association of Regional Councils (SCARC) annual conference will be held at the Embassy Suites in Kingston Plantation in Myrtle Beach. The opening reception is Sunday evening November 23<sup>rd</sup>, and it runs through Tuesday morning November 25<sup>th</sup>. (That is the usual Thanksgiving week schedule.) A registration form is attached. Please return it to Carol tonight if you know you're going or, in any case, by Friday, October 11<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. Back in March I told you that Workforce Director Hank Amundson would be assuming the additional responsibility of Interim Aging Director and Finance Director Sherry Smith would be taking on additional Aging Program duties until a new Aging Director was hired next year. This arrangement is working well. I also said I expected to adjust their salaries during the interim period to reflect these additional duties, and that has been done in line with the recommendation of our HR consultant in Beaufort.
- 3. The Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) is implementing significant changes to the federal grants process. It will change a lot that we do and how we do it here at the COG. Sherry and I attended a two-day briefing on the changes this week in Columbia and will be working with staff here to understand and implement the changes. If your jurisdiction is itself administering any federal grants, I suggest you check with your staff to be sure they are aware of and preparing for these changes.
- 4. Planning Director Ginnie Kozak has been appointed to one of the SCDOT steering committees charged with implementing the state's new Multi-Modal Transportation Plan.
- 5. Hank and I attended a recent Aging Program meeting with the new Lieutenant Governor Yancey McGill, who, by the way, is also the incoming president of SCARC.
- 6. Do you remember where you were 25 years ago when Hurricane Hugo hit the S. C. coast? I certainly do.
