ASPCA to Transport Dogs from the Beaufort County Animal Services Facility and Hilton Head Humane Association to Washington, D.C. for Adoption

Today, the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) will transport adoptable dogs from the Beaufort County Animal Services Facility and the Hilton Head Humane Association to the Washington Animal Rescue League in Washington, D.C. The transport is part of the ASPCA's Nancy Silverman Rescue Ride Program, which aims to save thousands of dogs by transporting them from overcrowded shelters in the southeast to loving homes in the northeast.

"The ASPCA's work continues to make a difference for Beaufort County's homeless animals," said Tallulah Trice, Beaufort County Animal Services Director. "Thank you ASPCA and Nancy Silverman for partnering with the Beaufort County Animal Services Facility and Hilton Head Humane Association to relocate our animals so that we may continue to focus on our campaign to reduce overpopulation, costs, disease, and euthanasia at our facility."

The dogs will be transported safely in a new custom-built animal relocation vehicle that is operated by the ASPCA. This is one of several planned transports with the Beaufort County Animal Services Facility and Hilton Head Humane Association as part of the rescue ride program.

"We are excited to collaborate with the Beaufort County Animal Services Facility and Hilton Head Humane Association to give these dogs a second chance at the loving home they all deserve," said Michelle Cascio, ASPCA Director for East Coast Animal Relocation. "We are looking forward to continuing working with these organizations to save more lives."
