

Following Hurricane Matthew in October 2016, Beaufort County Council designated UWOTL as the agency responsible for collecting, administering and distributing funds for the wide array of disaster services that were required for so many of our residents.



To date, UWOTL has fielded 1,000+ local callers via its <u>Helpline</u> since Hurricane Matthew and provided 1,300+ referrals to <u>partner agencies</u> for assistance with different needs categories, such as:

- 648 cases related to housing (repair, displacement, etc.)
- 332 cases related to basic needs (food, clothing, diapers, medicine, etc.)
- 187 cases related to issues with utilities
- 58 cases related to employment or transportation
