## Did You Know: FEMA Decisions Can Be Appealed

Hurricane Matthew survivors in South Carolina can appeal for more assistance if they disagree with the Federal Emergency Management Agency's decisions regarding their applications.

According to a news release issued by FEMA, registered survivors can appeal FEMA's decision by taking the following actions:

- Submit a written appeal explaining why the survivor disagrees with the decision. The letter must include supporting documents and must be signed and dated.
- List the FEMA registration number on every page along with the disaster name "DR-4286-SC."
- Mail the letter and supporting documents in the same envelope within 60 days of receiving the determination letter to:
