### **CALL TO ORDER:**

Chairman Glenn Stanford called the meeting to order at 2:30 p.m.

### **REVIEW OF MINUTES:**

Chairman Stanford asked if there were any changes to the Minutes from the July 19, 2018, Board meeting. Hearing none, Ms. Humphrey made a motion and Mr. Theodore seconded the motion to accept the Minutes from the July 19, 2018 Board meeting. The motion was carried unanimously to accept the minutes from the July 19, 2018, Board meeting (FOR: Boehme, Brown, Humphrey, Stanford and Theodore).

### **GENERAL DISCUSSION**

# **Tanger Median Landscape Project Update:**

Beaufort County Staff met with Hilton Head Landscapes and their Landscape Architect Consultant, Dan Keefer, on July 27, 2018 for the pre-construction meeting. The Landscape Architect recommended that the plantings be installed once the weather becomes cooler and requested a 3-month time extension. The County, Board and SCDOT agreed that the time extension was warranted. Hilton Head Landscapes is expected to resume work on November 1<sup>st</sup> and will order plants, confirm the underground utility locations, layout & perform grub-work for the plant beds, install the plantings and be completed no later than December 31, 2018.

# **Berkeley Hall Landscape Project Funding Sources:**

The Board is confident that Mr. Eric Greenway is committed to and actively working on getting the funding needed to complete this segment of the Highway 278 Master Landscape Plan. SCDOT approved Tiller's landscape plan on August 24, 2017 and the plantings must be installed before the encroachment permit expires on August 24, 2019.

# <u>Landscape Architect Design Requirement & Project Oversight for Remaining Six Miles of Highway 278 Medians:</u>

Because this Board does not have a budget set aside for Beautification projects, there are some cost saving measures that can be taken, once a funding source is identified, to reduce the layers of project costs. With prior approval and permission from Ms. Jennifer Gruber at SCDOT, median landscape plans can be prepared by a landscape designer. In addition, the Landscape Architect oversight requirement on the landscape installation contract adds approximately \$6,000 per mile and can be eliminated and assigned to the Community Development Staff.

# **NEW BUSINESS**

# Report on Funding Sources identified by Keep Beaufort Beautiful:

Ms. Foss did some grant research and found that small grants are potentially available, but will not go far to fund this Board's projects.

Chairman Stanford suggested that some of the SBCCB and KBB members attend each other's Board meetings, but due to the limited scope of the SBCCBB, the two Boards shouldn't be combined.

Many road improvement projects include contingencies and if there is surplus money at the end of these types of projects, perhaps the funds could be used for landscape beautification.

# Report on Various Terms and Term Limits in Office for Board Members:

Each term of office for the SBCCBB is four years in length. The Chairman would like the vacancy on the Board filled. Mr. Boehme suggested that Chris Marsh would be a good lead to a find a replacement for Henry Diercxsens.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

### **2019 Meeting Schedule:**

The Board unanimously agreed to meet on the third Thursday of each month, alternating the meeting location between the Beaufort County Government Center in Bluffton and the Hilton Head Library. County Staff will contact the Hilton Head Library for the meeting room availability.

# **Beaufort County Connect Mobile App:**

Mr. Boehme stated that according to SCDOT, there was a 25% litter reduction in 2018 from 2017 thanks to the Keep Beaufort Beautiful litter pick up efforts. Chairman Stanford asked Mr. Boehme to write a public awareness letter to the local newspaper Editors to notify the public that the BC Connect mobile app is available and could be used to report litter issues in the County.
