# Background

- Fast paced development
- Degradation of May River headwaters
- Primarily reactive approach in the past
- Large amounts of data collected
- Coordinated proactive campaign needed
  - Strategies and projects for sustainable watershed (toolbox)
  - Dynamic and adaptable document, future calibrations
  - Provide measureable goals
  - Partnerships and Funding



# History



- Town Council Approved the hiring of consultant for MRWAP completion (August 10, 2010)
- AMEC contract executed (November 12, 2010)
- MRWAP Kickoff Meeting (December 10, 2010)
- Draft MRWAP released for public review and comment (July 18, 2011)
- Public review and comment period over (August 17, 2011)
- Draft MRWAP presented to Town of Bluffton Water Quality Technical Advisory Committee (August 30, 2011)
- Draft MRWAP presented to Town of Bluffton May River Waterbody Management Plan Implementation Committee (August 31, 2011)
- Public Workshop and Draft MRWAP presentation (October 12, 2011)
- Draft MRWAP Planning Commission Presentation (October 26, 2011)
- Town Council Presentation and Adoption (November 10, 2011)





# Public and Stakeholder Participation

- Public Comment Period (July 18, 2011 – August 17, 2011)
  - Document belongs to the Town and stakeholders.
  - Purpose to seek feedback from public and stakeholders, found to be successful
  - Over 250 total comments and suggestions (email / written / verbal)
    - Top Comment Categories:
      - TDR / Conservation Easements / Land Use (41)
      - Impervious surfaces / Modeling efforts (35)
      - Funding / Grants / Partnering (23)
      - Informational (20)
      - Proposed Projects / Locations / Rankings (17)

- **Now:** *Get Everything on The Table*
  - Partial budgeting, lay a foundation.
  - What steps can we take now – should we?

### ■ Restoration measures:

- *How do we address current development?*
- *engineering-based solutions...*

### ■ Prevention measures:

- *How do we address the PUDs and existing Development Agreements?*
- *planning-based solutions...*





## Two Parallel Efforts.....

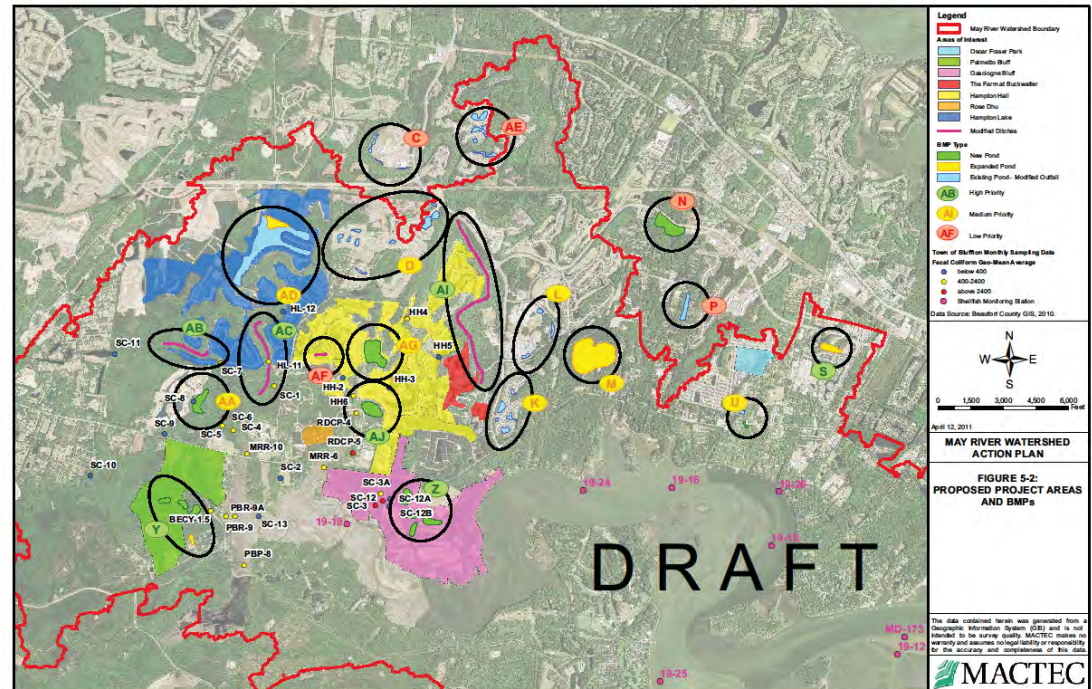
- **Restoration measures:** *engineering-based* solutions, to mitigate impacts from existing development.
  - “Low hanging fruit” projects:
    - Reasonably high confidence in their effectiveness
    - Coordinate with existing CIP programs to save time and money.
  - More elaborate structural practices:
    - Presented as conceptual project locations
    - General project types, sizes, and locations to envision.
  - Prioritization
    - Based on rough-order-of-magnitude (ROM) costs and benefits
    - Used planning level information (i.e. GIS maps).
    - More details (models, design, cost) needed before committing.



# Structural – Restoration...



- Proposed BMP projects and associated rankings
  - Status of the Town's impervious analysis
  - Imperviousness limits for new development
  - More details on the reasoning behind the project rankings
  - Determining runoff volumes
  - Modeling efforts







## Two Parallel Efforts.....

- **Prevention measures:** *planning-based* solutions for the PUDs, requiring long-term discussions on complex topics.
  - Changes to traditional development practices
  - Transfer of development rights (TDR)
  - Policy updates
  - Incentives

*Fair and effective tactics to be developed in short-term to avoid long-term ecological impacts and economical hardships.*

- Available grants and funding opportunities
  - Broad set of options
  - Quarterly assessments – opportunities change over time
- Marketing and communication
  - New Outreach Campaign – build on existing programs
  - The “May River” brand
