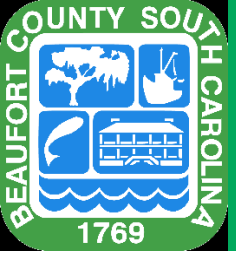

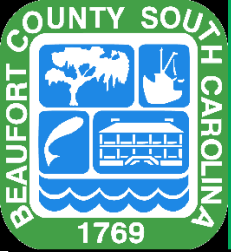

# Why is redistricting happening now?

The State has adopted the Federal Decennial Census conducted in 2020.

S.C. Code Ann. Sec. 4-9-90 requires that all County Council districts be reapportioned as to population by County Council within a reasonable time prior to the next scheduled general election which is scheduled for November 2022.

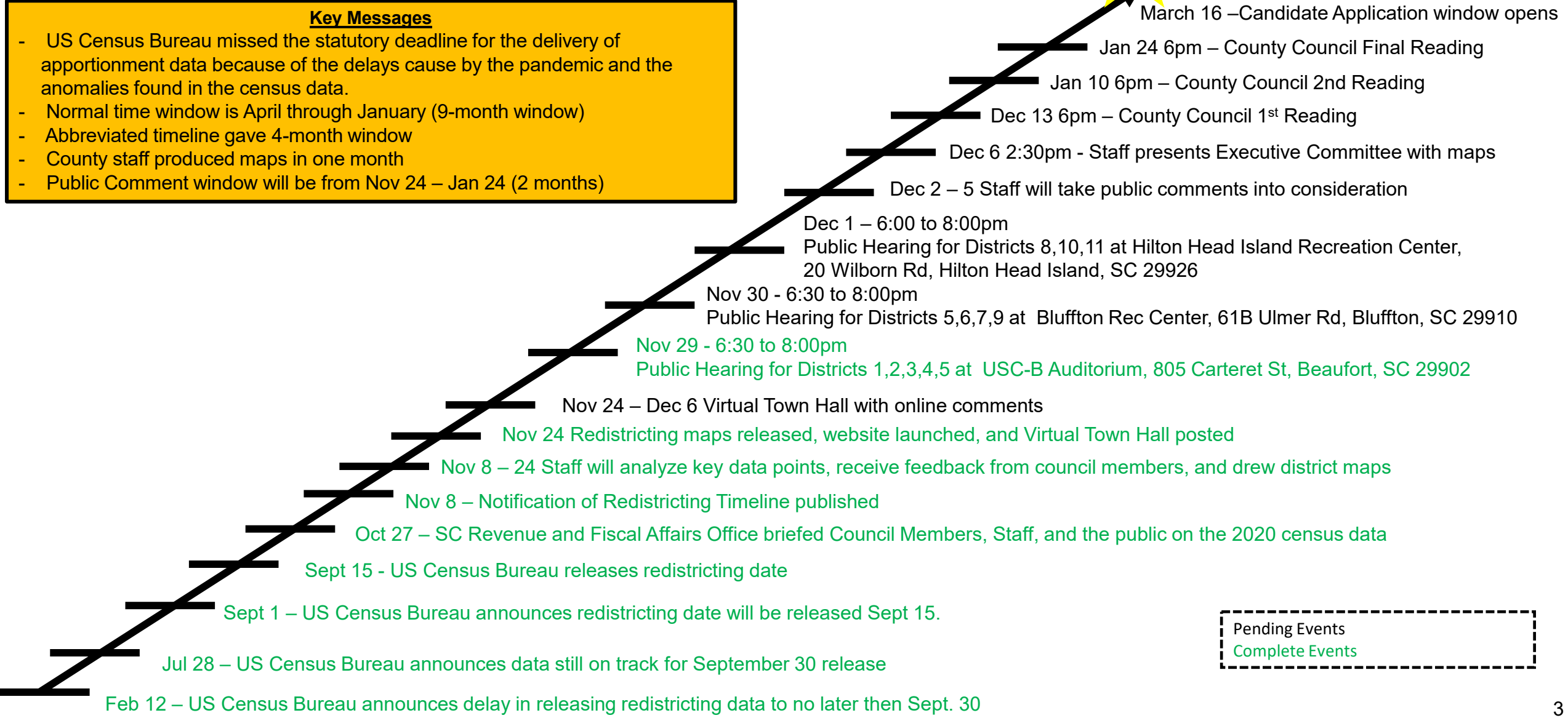

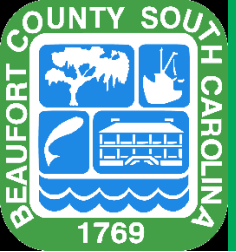
New County Council Maps

## Key Messages

- US Census Bureau missed the statutory deadline for the delivery of apportionment data because of the delays cause by the pandemic and the anomalies found in the census data.
- Normal time window is April through January (9-month window)
- Abbreviated timeline gave 4-month window
- County staff produced maps in one month
- Public Comment window will be from Nov 24 – Jan 24 (2 months)

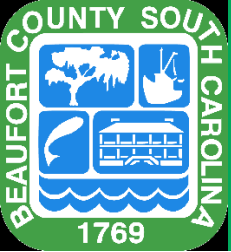

# What are the criteria used for redistricting?

1. County Council districts shall be of equal population, or as nearly practical, to comply and adhere to the Constitutional requirement of one person, one vote.
2. The population variance between County Council districts shall not exceed 5%. This is lower than the 10% required by S.C. Code Ann. Sec. 4-9-90.
3. County Council districts must comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act to ensure that minorities have an equal opportunity to elect representatives of their choice.
4. County Council districts must be contiguous.
5. County Council districts should be drawn to minimize the division of voting precincts, and, when feasible, with respect to existing districts and communities of interest.
6. County Council districts should be geographically compact to the extent practicable, so that nearby areas of population are not bypassed for a more distant population.
7. County Council districts must comply with all other applicable court decisions and Federal and State laws.
8. Public input should be solicited throughout the process.

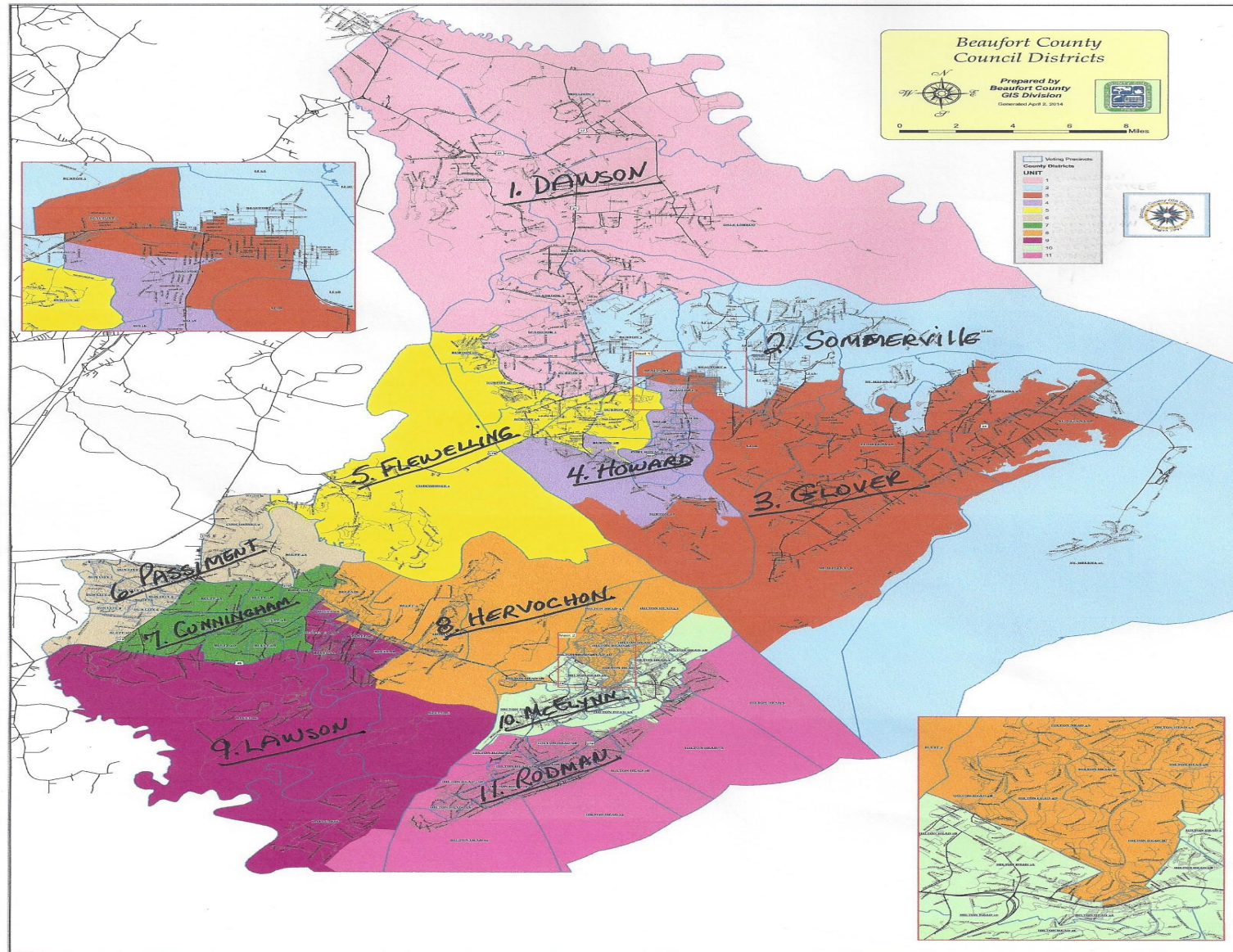


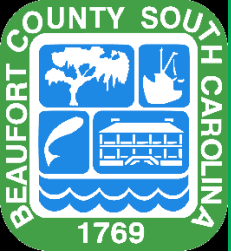

It is the intention of Council to hold specific meetings around the county to inform the public of the changes needed to comply with the reapportionment of all county council districts.

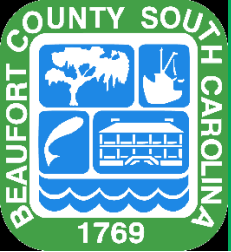

## Redistricting Beaufort County

Redistricting is the process of enacting new district boundaries. District lines are redrawn every ten years following the completion of the United States census. Federal law stipulates that districts must have nearly equal populations and not discriminate based on race or ethnicity. Boundaries must also be as contiguous and compact as possible and keep communities of interest in their entirety.
