City of Beaufort Special Election

- Date of Election: July 19, 2011
- One city council seat to fill
- Voters eligible = ~6,900
- 11 precincts involved
 - 6 partial
 - 5 whole
- 7 polling locations31 poll workers

City of Beaufort Special Election

- Absentee precincts are open
- DOJ preclearance granted for precinct changes
- EVRL will be used (one per precinct)
- Poll worker training
 - Thursday, July 14, 6 8 PM
 - Monday, July 18, 10 AM 12 PM

S. 209 - Absentee Qualifications

- Primary purpose(s):
 - Allow "no-excuse" absentee voting
 - Allow absentee application to be completed on line
- Status:
 - Jan 11 Referred to Senate Judiciary Committee Election Laws

S. 333 - Notice of Death

- Primary purpose(s):
 - Coroner must provide notice of death to CEC
 - Funeral directors must provide notice of death to CEC
- Status:
 - Jan 11 Referred to Senate Judiciary Committee

S. 391 - Absentee Voting

- Primary purpose(s):
 - Adjusts time to open absentee ballots
 - Adjusts filing dates
- Status:
 - June 15 House motion to reconsider bill tabled

<u>S. 404 – SC UOCAVA Act</u>

• Primary purpose(s):

- Allows absentee voters in OS isolated areas to submit a federal write-in absentee ballot for any federal, state, or local office or ballot initiative
- Requires electronic free access ballot tracking system
- Waives witness requirement for <u>all</u> UOCAVA voters
- Specifies 45-day requirement for mailing ballots
- Status:
 - June 7 Signed into law by Gov Haley
- Impact to Beaufort County voters
 - None...this act reinforces pre-existing federal laws and standards already followed

H. 3003 - Photo ID / Absentee Voting

- Primary purpose(s):
 - Requires photo ID
 - Definition of "Domicile" given greater fidelity
 - Absentee application requests mail or walk-in only
 - Absentee voting becomes paper only
- Status:
 - May 24, 2011 Signed into law by Gov Haley
 - Implementation contingent upon funding and approval of DOJ under Section 5 of Voting Rights Act
- Impact:
 - Specific impact to Beaufort County is unknown...state is working details of implementation

H. 3110 - Registration by Party

- Primary purposes(s):
 - Requires registration by party
- Status:
 - Jan 11 Referred to House Judiciary Comm.

H. 3349 - Overseas Absentee Voting

• Primary purpose(s):

 U.S. citizens who have never lived in the U.S., but whose parents are registered in SC, may register to vote where the parents are qualified electors . . . If they are not otherwise registered

• Status:

Feb 23 – Referred to Senate Judiciary Comm.

H. 3433 - Beaufort County Precincts

- Primary purpose(s):
 - Splits select over-sized precincts south of the Broad River
 - Consolidates select under-sized Hilton Head precincts
- Status:

Feb 23 - Referred to Senate Judiciary Comm.

<u>H. 3392 - Multi-faceted (S. 391)</u>

• Primary purpose(s):

- Establishes standing protocol for make-up elections
- Opening absentee ballots may begin at 9 am
- Accelerates party primary submissions to CEC and SEC from April 9 to April 5
- Presidential/VP candidates must be certified to SEC NLT 1st Tues following 1st Mon in Sept

• Status:

Feb 23 – Referred to Senate Judiciary Comm.

H. 3700 & 3701 - Appropriations Bill 2011-2012

- Senate proposal includes stipend for election and voter registration commissioners
- Status:
 - Currently in Conference Committee
